

## Generic samples: *Suggestions in green italic.*

**Example 1.** *Touches all the bases thoroughly, with perhaps a hint of obsequiousness. Somewhat overkilled.*

Pursuant to FCC Rule Section CFR 47, part 11.21(d), (Radio or TV station) Wxxx, (City of license) provides the following information, regarding multi-lingual EAS operation:

(1) The primary language of programming on Wxxx is English, and the Station values the diversity of its audience and embraces the inclusion of all. Wxxx does not currently air EAS alerts or tests in any language other than English.

(2) Wxxx would be likely to air EAS alerts in one or more languages other than English when:

- Wxxx receives, from an authorized EAS source, verified EAS alerts in a language other than English.
- Infrastructure and necessary mechanisms exist for station management to be reasonably certain that non-English EAS alerts are accurate and understandable in their respective language.
- Wxxx's audience is expected to include non-English speakers of the language(s) in which such EAS alerts are being made available by an authorized EAS source.

Wxxx encourages exploration of further technological advances, which may present an opportunity for our station(s) to receive and transmit EAS alerts in a multiplicity of languages and formats, thus affording us an additional means of serving our audience and community. Considering current technological limitations, Wxxx has no practicable plans to disseminate multilingual EAS alerts in the foreseeable future.

(3) No further info, at this time. A population breakdown of the Wxxx service area, by ethnicity, will be done when deemed appropriate.

### **Example 2:**

Radio station Wxxx re: Multi-lingual EAS inquiry.

- A description of any actions taken by the EAS Participant to make EAS alert content available in languages other than English to its non-English speaking audience(s);
- A description of any future actions planned by the EAS Participant to provide EAS alert content in languages other than English to its non-English speaking audience(s), along with an explanation for the EAS Participant's decision to plan or not plan such actions; and
- Any other relevant information that the EAS Participant may wish to provide.

1. No actions were taken to provide EAS in another language.

2. No future actions are planned to provide EAS in another language. *It is our understanding that there is currently no viable system available to radio broadcasters.*
